The physical and spiritual centre of the company is the M.V. Kipawo. In the beginning she served as our stage, and now joins metaphorically what she once did physically: people, places and ideas. In 1985 'the Kip' was moved from the beach of the lower harbour to a berth prepared at extreme high tide at the upper end of the harbour. She was trimmed and secured from the daily rise and fall of the Bay of Fundy. A wharf was built around her and previously a tent was erected each summer over her foredeck to house the theatre. The 2004 season was the first in our new theatre built around the M.V. Kipawo, which serves as our lobby and reception

The Ottawa House By-The-Sea Museum, built in 1765, is a unique attraction alon the Parrsborough Shore. It contains an assemblage of over 450 artifacts, which are on display in an open visitor friendly environment. You can walk through the rooms of this historic building, the summer home of Sir Charles Tupper in 1871 and step from time period to time period, from the decks of a schooner to entering the summer boudoir of Mrs. Tupper. From the hugh windows overlooking the front verandah you can enjoy the magnificent vista of the Minas Basin with its daily 40 foot tides.



Visit an Authentic Dutch Cheese Farm. We have been producing our "Farmstead Gouda" since 1980. Following an age old, hands on process without full pasteurization, straight as it comes from the cows. Shaped into golden wheels with a natural rind, allowing them to breathe and thus interact with the air surrounding it; Aged under conditions subject to the seasons, as before the age of refrigeration. It is believed that optimal ripening occurs at temperatures around 12-15*C (our storage room varies from 10-18*C depending on the time of year).
