Thoroughly Plan Your Garden Project

As we start up another gardening season, let's make sure we have what we need before starting on large garden projects. Make a list of what all you plan to do with the area you have selected. Draw out a diagram of what you want it to look like once it is finished.

If you are planning a water project, such as a pond, make sure the area is suited to host it. Often we think "a pond would look wonderful just there...." but don't think "I need to bring water to the pond from..."

Plants which work well in deep ponds will not work well in shallow ponds. Water lilies are beautiful but will

take over the whole pond if you aren't careful.

Then you need to consider the critters that will also enjoy your pond. If you put in fish then you will need some sort of hiding place for them or netting over top. Even so, some of your fish will get eaten! Both birds and raccoons like fresh fish.

Moving water will attract birds and butterflies, but also raccoons and skunks and maybe an occasional goose or duck. Planning ahead makes sense.

You may wish to just put in some bushes or trees with a nice bench or two. Remember these will expand and not stay the size you plant them. Also, if planting trees,

remember that their roots will travel a long ways, as a tree's roots equal its height. Don't plant trees too close to your house or your well. Bushes can be trimmed and flowering bushes will attract birds and butterflies to your garden.

If you are thinking of putting in stones for a walkway, be sure to use a level to make sure that they are even. You don't want your guests, or yourself for that matter, tripping over the edges and maybe having a bad fall. You can make some interesting pathways in a garden with just a few stones and some bushes.
