Five WWI airplanes and a WWII Spitfire replica landed at Debert Airport on May 20th as part of a family day of flight and remembrance hosted by the Truro Flying Club. The vintage airplanes were returning from the 100th Anniversary Ceremonies at Vimy Ridge. During World War II the Royal Canadian Air Force aerodrome at Debert was used as a British Commonwealth Air Training Plan facility for training airmen. The public was invited to meet local pilots & instructors of the Truro Flying Club, visit the vintage aircraft and classic car display and possibly take to the skies for a tour over Colchester County from a small airplane.




