Other groups where she has spent many volunteer hours include: Age of Sail Heritage Museum; Cumberland County Community Health Board; three years as chair, Robert Cochrane War Memorial; 10 years as chair, Parkinson’s Support Group and many other initiatives to benefit the community.

She has worked hard to improve internet service; get defibrillators for two halls, a Canada-wide speaker for Canada cares; organized educational seminars, exercise classes for disabled and seniors; flu shots, foot clinics, an annual “free” winter clothing event; various community dinners, community cleanup day, plus three times a year edits and produces “Seas and Greetings, a community newsletter.

Her volunteering has included many other initiatives and has touched the lives of all community residents.
