

NSFA Continues to be the Voice of Nova Scotia's Farmers

Nova Scotia Federation of Agriculture (NSFA) has made progress on key issues that have been impacting farm operations and the agriculture industry as a whole. Firstly, we worked with Nova Scotia Power on alternatives to 3-phase power for those farms that have access to single-phase power. NSP explored phase converter options and are now able to support farms and other small business that are investing in converter technologies.

Last year we also gained progress on financing options for small scale farms - the Nova Scotia Farm Loan Board recently announced a Microloan Program designed to meet the needs of farms looking for a small loan. NSFA advocated collaboratively on emerging issues such as the proposed changes to taxation of private corporations, Safe Food for Canadians Act proposed regulations and a Food Policy for Canada.

While progress can still be made in areas such as protecting agricultural land, eliminating the labour gap and increasing the public's trust in our industry, we are gaining ground and there is evidence to suggest that the industry is moving forward.

NSFA has been active on the land file for many years now. Over the last 12 months or so, significant traction has been made on the efforts to protect agricultural land - the Agriculture Land Inventory Project has been updated. A resolution was passed at the Union of Nova Scotia Municipalities annual con-
