During a vacation to Fort Lauderdale in 1964, he decided to sell his interests in the automotive business to his partner and "retire" to sunny Florida with his young family. After a year of beach and golf, Al got itchy to get back into the car business and created a fleet division for one of the largest Chrysler Plymouth dealerships in the U.S. Following a successful decade in business in the US, the family moved to Truro, N.S. where he opened Truro Chrysler Plymouth, followed by a partnership in a Lincoln Mercury franchise, and finally opening Hollis Ford in 1990. An avid singer, Al was a member of various barbershop quartets and choirs for over 75 years. During the 50's, he and his quartet, "The Major Chords," won numerous championships in competition. As a business leader, Al was a long-time member of the Rotary Club of Truro and active in their community projects.
