

## Standing Room Only

We began council with an in camera meeting at 5:00 pm on May 1st covering five topics. Public council followed with three presentations. WOW controversy brings out the public! I have been on council six years and it was the first time the gallery was full with standing room only!

99% were there to hear and support the presentation on jobs related to Northern Pulp and the effect on

Cumberland. The presentation was professional and noted 500+ jobs will be affected if the mill closes next January.

One thing I noted is that the citizens in the gallery were young, something we desperately need in the municipality and cannot afford to lose to the west. They are requesting council send a letter to the province requesting Northern Pulp be given the necessary time to construct the solution. It is estimated it will require 22 months from when shovels hit the ground. Council will

vote next council on May 15th. Maybe gallery will be full again!

The 2nd presentation was an update on the sinkhole in Oxford and that monies were approved to help figure out next steps. Next was a presentation on needs for the new stage in Pugwash once construction is complete, including sound equipment, lighting and some furnishings. Discussion will follow at budget meeting.

Public hearing on second hand smoke bylaw was held with no discussion followed by motion to approve. A motion was approved concerning the reimbursement policy for council and CAO was given notice of intent to consider for adoption.

Final chapter of Wheeler

Report was discussed. The relative severity of the most significant hazards were covered, vehicle traffic effects, industrial nuisance - i.e. noise, lights etc and community economic impact. Bottom line is that much work needs to be done by the province and community buy-in needs to be there in order to consider hydraulic fracturing in the future.

A policy to appoint a traffic authority for Springhill and Parrsboro will be presented to council by staff at next council. A Town of Amherst building inspector was approved as a building inspector for the municipality. A grant request was approved from District 4 funds.

Other matters which included approved motions

included: A change in board members at East Cumberland Lodge; An offer to tour RCMP headquarters in Dartmouth, sometime in June; Notice to consider adoption of the amended tax reduction and exemption policy.

Information items included upcoming volunteer night on May 7th; Lyme disease awareness month and Cumberland RCMP first quarter report.

Do not forget low income tax exemption for citizens. Pass the word.


