

Chamber Offers Essential E-Commerce Program

Supporting business to reach online markets is the focus of a program being offered by The Truro & Colchester Chamber of Commerce.

Taking businesses from bricks and mortar to establishing an on-line presence is key to maintaining sales and reaching new customers said Chamber Executive Director Sherry Martell.

"We know businesses are struggling right now under a provincial lockdown due to a resurgence of COVID-19 cases, which reinforces the importance of having online shops or web presence so customers can source what they need locally," said Martell. "We know 85 per cent of Canadians are now shopping online. Consumer habits have shifted and the Chamber is working hard to support businesses to be prepared to serve customers in new ways that will increase profitability, raise consumer confidence and help them rebound."

According to a recent study completed by BDC, during the first four months of the pandemic, e-commerce sales exceeded those of the 2019 holiday season. Selling online should no longer be considered optional, but rather, it has now become even more essential for businesses of all types and sizes

to create new opportunities for business growth and boosting resilience.

Funding for this project is provided by the Atlantic Canadian Opportunities Agency through its Regional Relief Recovery Fund to assist business in extraordinary circumstances during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Chamber first launched the program in June of 2020 and assisted nearly 20 businesses in establishing online marketing or improving E-Commerce capabilities by the end of March 2021. The business organization recently received an extension from ACOA to continue to offer the low to no-cost program to business in central Nova Scotia.

"Our goal is to support as many small businesses as possible in using E-commerce to their advantage in a way that fits their business model, as well as support businesses currently engaging in e-commerce to enhance their services or streamline processes," said the Executive Director. "We will also be offering educational workshops on a number of e-commerce related topics and promoting the benefits of supporting local business through their online shops."

The program application is available on the Chamber's website, www.trurocolchesterchamber.com. Businesses eligible to

apply must have been in operation more than 12 months, are registered with the Nova Scotia Registry of Joint Stocks or a comparable federal body, and have not already received direct financial support from the Chamber's e-commerce project from June 2020-March 2021.

The program can provide a reimbursement of up to 100 per cent of the eligible costs (pre HST) up to a maximum amount per business. This amount is based on the results of the applicant's needs assessment completed by a marketing professional assigned by the Truro & Colchester Chamber of Commerce project manager.

"We are very proud to offer this vital program at low to no cost to our business community as one of our many COVID-19 relief efforts," said Martell. "We are dedicated to providing support to business during these challenging times and welcome any business needing support to reach out to us for assistance."

Eligible Expenses in the program include: Training and coaching related to the operation of the selected online platform, professional services to assist with the setup of an online platform to allow for sales to customers, and enhancements of existing websites.

Border Restrictions Still in Effect

It is not know how long border restrictions will remain in place to fight the CoVid pandemic. It was announced on May 10th only permanent residents of Nova Scotia and people travelling for essential reasons can enter the province. The province has been in a lockdown since May 10th.

People can apply for an exception if they have: a purchase or sale agreement for a property purchase in 2021 showing that an offer has been accepted on or be-

fore April 21 and closing date is on or before May 20; a minimum one-year lease signed on or before April 21 and beginning on or before May 20 and a letter of acceptance for new employment in Nova Scotia that cannot be done virtually or deferred; the letter must be dated on or before May 7.

People who move to Nova Scotia must still complete their 14-day quarantine and are encouraged to get tested at the beginning and end of their isolation.
