Bible Hill Partners with Local Schools

Village of Bible Hill has recently partnered with two local schools, Bible Hill Consolidated Elementary and Chiganois Elementary, to put forth a new community initiative to have local student artwork displayed on street banners within the Village of Bible Hill. It all started with a simple phone call from Donna MacLeod, a Grade 5 teacher at Chiganois Elementary, that flourished into a beautiful community partnership with area schools to promote the arts.

This project has been incorporated into the student's school curriculum with a focus on spring theme. Students in both Grades 4 and 5 have been working diligently to showcase their talent and artistry on their very own banner. With the hiring of local creative solutions professional John Sperry with JAS3D designs and the grant funding from Truro and Area Community Health Board, this initiative has been put into action and is providing a unique and creative opportunity to the

students.

The schools were able to access a Health Promoting Schools Grant from Nova Scotia Health. This is a one-time \$5000 grant offered to schools who apply. Both schools developed a leadership team and with the support of Shali Manuel at Health NS, they continue to come up with innovating ideas for the funds to make the school an even healthier and happier environment.

Students enjoyed working on the project and took pride in expressing themselves through their artwork knowing that it was going up in public. As part of the planning process, the two schools met virtually through a Google Meet to brainstorm ideas for the banners. The students at both schools are extremely excited to see their artwork go on display for all to see and enjoy.
