"The next step will be to try and get some building materials including lumber and plumbing fixtures," she says.

ward to finish some other projects on the 'wish list' at the Thirsty Church, now that it is not so thirsty any more. "I hope finishing the well will inspire others to step forward and help out, too. The Lord gives in many ways," he says.
Amanda was pleasantly surprised with a recent turn out at the annual meeting for Londonderry Station Community Church. "We had 11 Trustees nominated and last August we only had three. We now have a solid govern-

ing board to move forward and make decisions. It is our intent to make sure all the projects, people in the area wanted, will be completed. We welcome public input," she says.
Amanda wants everyone to know that the Thirsty Church will serve a unique function in the community and not compete with the existing Community Centre. "We want to work together," she says, "We are too small a community to compete."
