Five Islands Quilters Busy for IWK

Children at the IWK Hospital in Halifax will soon be warm and cozy in their new "Cuddle Quilts" thanks to a labor of love by several Five Islands area quilters.

A "Quilt-a-Thon" was held at the Five Islands Bazaar from January 23rd to 27th. Eight quilters were joined by other volunteers from the community who helped with the cutting and machine stitching.

Rose Lewis says the project was her "bright idea", after reading about a similar project in a magazine. "It had never been done here before but I knew there were at least half dozen quilters in this

area," she says. "We all had little pieces of material left over from larger quilting projects which I knew we could use for the tops. The Five Islands Bazaar donates to a charity every year and this year they donated the quilt batting and thread."

The tops of the quilts were machine sewn in a "Nine Block" pattern and then hand quilted to the backing. Six quilt frames were set up over two rooms at the Bazaar.

Rose says the quilters enjoyed themselves and it was seldom quiet, as they shared in conversation while they worked. Many of the quilters, including Rose, were taught by their grandmother years ago. Iona Canning, who is 90 years young, was lending a helping hand throughout the week, as well.

The enthusiastic quilters completed 30 "Cuddle Quilts" in January. "We still had loads of our scrap material left, so we decided to do this again in February", says Rose.

By the time they finished on February 23rd, an additional 20 cuddle quilts had been completed. All 50 cuddle quilts will be delivered to the IWK in the near future. Sick children will be surrounded not only in the warmth of a cozy blanket but also the love of the volunteers who worked on them.
