have knit enough 8 inch squares to sew together and make a patchwork afghan.

When the blanket is completed they will donate it to a homeless shelter in Truro. During this time of year many people who are down on their luck need support from the communities around them. Homeless shelters do not get enough recognition and this is our little way of saying thank-you and supporting those in need.

A big thank-you to Miss. Bowers who knit 80 squares and donated them to the cause! If you would like to help in the making of the blanket you can do this by casting on 40 stitches of 2 ply knitting worsted yarn on size 4 or 5 mm needles. The squares are 8 inches by 8 inches or 20cm by 20cm. Because this is a patchwork afghan color and pattern do not matter. Squares can be brought to the school anytime throughout the week.

The production of The Wizard of Oz has been going great and everyone is working very hard! Auditions have been held and the cast list has a variety of students from all different grades. No one has been left out and everyone is excited to begin rehearsals. Director Leana Todd has been working with students on Fridays after school and volunteers have been busy ensuring that the production will be fabulous!
