On Sunday February 16, 2014 a group of 16 youth ages 9-19 from around the province met at the Fundy Snowmobile Club in Folly Lake. The Snowmobile Association of Nova Scotia (SANS) started the initiative of forming a youth program for the next generation of snowmobilers.

Youth from around the province were invited to attend a session which hosted two teenagers from Wisconsin, USA and their Youth Coordinator. They introduced their program to our youth and explained the leadership skills they have received, as well as, safety lessons while driving a snowmobile. They have traveled to many states across the

United States sharing how they started their Youth program called KAOS- Kids and Adults on Snowmobiles. This was their first trip to Canada.

They were very pleased with the warm hospitality they received while visiting Nova Scotia. While they were here they got to visit Peggy's Cove, learned how to eat lobster, get out for a drive on the local snowmobile trails as well as attend a Valentines Dinner hosted at the Cumberland Snowmobile Club.
