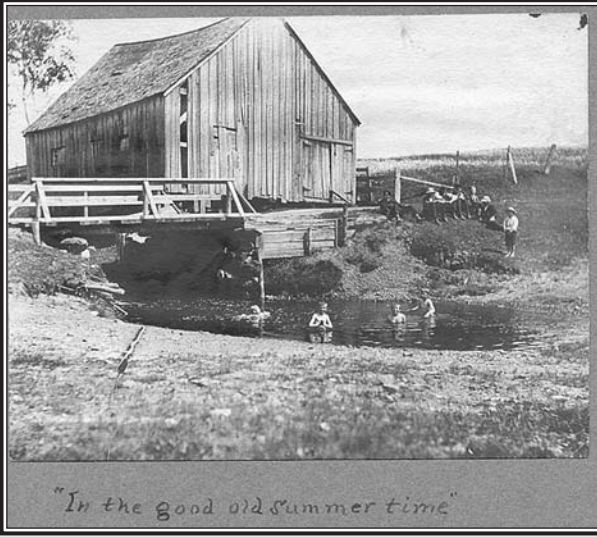


# Historic Sites

## "WHARF ROAD, GREAT VILLAGE"



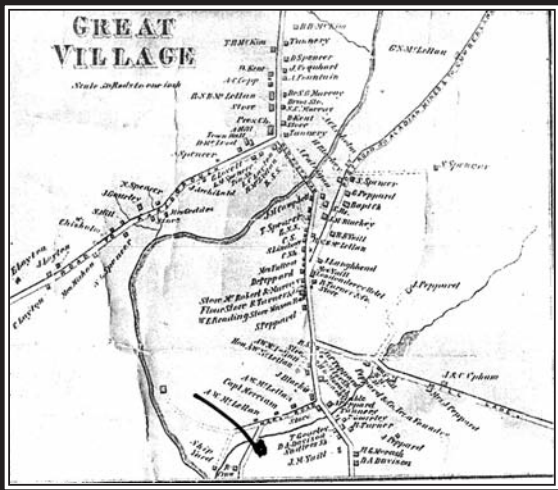

The arrow pointer on map 302 locates the spot on Wharf Road in Great Village where we think this photo was taken around 1900.

In the Archives, this photo is identified only as Colchester County, possibly Great Village. The bridge over the Peppard or Mill Brook, just below the Creamery seems to be the only place in the "Village" where this scene might present itself.

The eleven little boys, with four of their number in the water, no doubt "skinny dipping" brings back all that was good about summer. The left foreground and the area across the brook below the boys sitting in a row seems to indicate a wagon road bypassing the bridge and providing the "fording" spot where farmers would drive their teams, (horses or oxen) through the "watering hole".

Most bridges of the time had these "fordings" and it was a common sight in the summertime to see farmer's wagons stopped in the middle of the stream while the animals quenched their thirst.

About 120 friends and family stopped by the Great Village Legion on Saturday, Jan. 31st to pass along their best wishes and congratulations to Bernice Kaulback, who was celebrating her 90th birthday.

Bernice grew up on Scrabble Hill and has lived the past 28 years in MacCaull Villa. (Note- during the interview I discovered my great grandmother and her grandfather were brother and sister, so looks like we are family, too!). She says she married young, to Floyd Kaulback, and they had 12 children, one who sadly passed away at 2 months of age but in 90 years she never moved very far away. "I lived in 4 or 5 houses and never moved off the main road," laughs Bernice. "I always lived here and liked it here. I've never had any desire to live anywhere else."

In her younger years she was busy raising her family but now has time to enjoy crossword puzzles and she loves to read, including the odd romance novel. "That

never hurt anyone," she chuckles, clearly having a great sense of humor and sharp wit for her 90 years young.

Bernice recalls many changes over the years. "I used to walk to the bank with my mother and we had a barbershop, blacksmith and even a hotel here in Great Village." She attended the Great Village School, as did her mother, Laura Duncan.

Despite the changes, Bernice says she wouldn't want to be bringing up a family today. "We didn't have much money, my husband worked while I stayed home and looked after the children.

Today it takes two people working to make a living."

Bernice has enjoyed relatively good health throughout her lifetime and if it wasn't for a bad knee she would still be out dancing, as she once loved to do.

Besides her 11 children, Bernice has 23 grandchildren, 29 great grandchildren and 4 great great grandchildren and with the exception of a few who live out west, most of her family lives close by.

Bernice is looking forward to attending for the first time the annual Shoreline Journal Birthday Party for those over 90 years, held each May in Economy.
