Native Women's Association Receives \$386,730

The Departments of Women and Gender Equality and Rural Economic Development have provided \$386,376.00 for the Nova Scotia Native Women's Association for its project, Nova Scotia Indigenous Human Trafficking Prevention Strategy Program Department of Women and Gender Equality's Human Trafficking. Human trafficking

prevention is a key priority of the NSNWA. This funding will provide support to grow this initiative as part of their overall elimination of violence strategy for the Nova Scotia Native Women's Association (nsnwa.ca).

Throughout this 39 month project, the Nova Scotia Native Women's Association will develop and implement inter-

vention practices that will advance knowledge and enhance empowerment supports for at-risk populations and survivors of human trafficking in Nova Scotia. These practices will be created and delivered in a culturally relevant manner, utilizing Mi'kmaq language and methods as the foundation.


