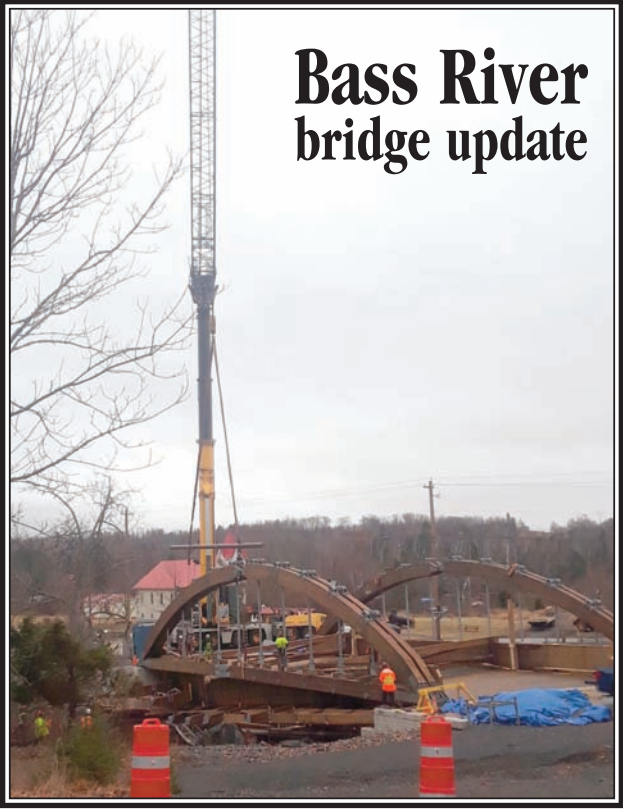




A large crane used to lift components for the new Bass River bridge reaches high towards the clouds on January 28th. (Rees Photo)
