Alana Yorke Presents: "The Weight" A STORY OF EMERGENCE

Alana Yorke (formerly of Bass River) is courageous. It's not every day that an artist shares such a personal journey. The video for Yorke's latest single, "The Weight", directed by Hannah McGrath, captures the hauntingly beautiful live performance of a song that was inspired by Yorke's experiences since running out of air while scuba diving in Nova Scotia. "The Weight" is a watery journey inward toward realization and a decision to emerge, which was filmed underground in a Cold War bunker in Debert.

"The Weight" was officially released on Friday, March 23rd in Halifax at 1313 Hollis Street and went online on Saturday, March 24th. Truro video launch was held on Saturday, April 21st, 2012 at Roadside Willies. The Truro show, not only, featured a screening of the video, but also be a very special show celebrating new material by Yorke. Yorke was joined by musicians Nicholas Maclean, as well as her husband, Ian Bent (formerly of Truro).

Music Development Officer for Nova Scotia Culture Division, Mickey Quase commented upon viewing of "The Weight": "I was completely entranced from the outset of the piece- and it wasn't until the end I realized I hadn't taken a breath the whole time. It was totally spellbinding".

Although the video became more of a hybrid with a music video, it was indeed a live performance.

Originally the video was intended as a one-shot video, however footage from multiple cameras and shots were used that documented Alana's journey traveling through the underground labyrinth of the bunker, searching and eventually emerging to the outside

Alana Yorke talks about "The Weight" in her own words: The song, "The Weight" is basically about the desire to emerge from the patterns of negative self-limiting thoughts and behaviors. On another level, parts of the song were inspired by an accident that happened to me a few years ago when I was scuba diving and the experiences that I've had since that event in my life. This project has been a huge catalyst for my healing and my emergence as an artist.
