

Great Village & District Fire Brigade Now 87 years of Service

Great Village & District Fire Brigade held their annual Awards Banquet on April 6th in the Londonderry Recreation Centre. The Brigade is currently in its 87th year.

Steve Karrell acted as MC for the evening, with Pat Murphy offering the Toast to the Queen and Cheryl Slack asking the Blessing.

Betty MacNeil made a cheque presentation of \$3000 to GV Fire Commission Treasurer Steve Karrell on behalf of the Great Village & District Fire Brigade Ladies Auxiliary. She reported the Auxiliary has been busy this past year with Bingo, Lobster Supper, Annual Auction and the July 1st Chicken BBQ.

Chief Dave Lundie reported the Brigade responded to 115 emergency calls in 2012, for a total of 1294 man hours. Another 772 man hours were spent on training and an additional 664 man hours on work nights. So far this year, there have been 32 emergency calls. MLA for Colchester North, Karen Casey was the guest speaker. She thanked the Brigade members for taking time out of their lives to volunteer with the Brigade and attend the necessary training courses to learn what is

required to be 'first on the scene' at motor vehicle accidents and medical calls, as well as fire calls.

Lottery Luck Strikes Twice in Glenholme

A few weeks ago Bruce MacAloney, owner of Glenholme General Store, was pleased with a \$1400 Lotto 649 win. He narrowly missed the big million dollar win, matching only 5 of the 6 winning numbers, but he still a nice bit of change in his pocket. Good news for the small community, but it was about to get even better.

A week after Bruce's lucky win, store employee Patti Weir was home checking the winning Keno Atlantic numbers on her computer at about 10 minutes after the 11PM draw, and could not believe what she saw. "I couldn't believe my eyes, so I called my boyfriend, Darren and asked him to check the numbers," she says. "When I read off my numbers, he said they were a match. It was then I started to realize I may have just won \$25,000. I was

so excited I called a lot of people and woke them up with the good news."

Patti, a single mom, waited until after school the next day to share her good news with her four daughters. "I wanted to make sure I was right," she says, "I took the ticket in to work and checked it on the lottery terminal."

Lottery retailers are permitted to buy tickets using a "retail sales" button. She bought her ticket at Glenholme General Store, where she works part time, using this retail sale button, so everything was legitimate.

"My girls are so excited when I finally broke the news. I told them I would give them each \$500 to go back to school shopping for clothes this fall, something they have never been able to do," says Patti.

Friday morning it was off

to Moncton to collect her big prize, taking along her friend Kim to share in the fun. "She took the day off work to come with me and it was sure a fun trip," says Patti, "After we presented the ticket at the Lottery Headquarters, we had to wait a few hours while they did an investigation. As soon as I got the \$25,000 cheque in my hand we went straight to the bank and deposited it into my account."

The money means a great deal to Patti who has been driving a van with no heater all winter because she couldn't afford to get it fixed. "Now I will be able to buy a good second hand car. I guess there is no hurry, I don't need the heater until winter," she laughs. Patti is also trying to fix up the inside of her house, and plans to use some of the money to help with those

expenses.

The \$25,000 was won matching 7 out 7 numbers on a \$5 ticket for Keno Atlantic. Patti says she has been playing the same numbers for a year and a half and has won a \$1000 and \$2000 prize a few years ago but never something this big.

This was also the first big win for Glenholme General Store. The store will receive a 1% (\$250) retailer bonus for selling the winning ticket.

Lady luck seems to be shining on the Glenholme area.
