Highland Village graduated from St Mary's with his Bachelor of Arts, majoring in Atlantic Canada studies.

June 1998, (Vol. 2, No.6) – Warren Leo Spence, who turns 93 next month recounts his experiences as a woodsman and warrior to Ken Kennedy in front page story. District 9 councilor, Keith Baas suggested a strong community council should be formed to lob by for economic development and recreational facilities in the area. Stacey Culgin details her findings of steam driving on the Chignoos River in the A. F. Church Map of the 1860's. In 1937 the three dams on the river were rebuilt by Sid McCully. Granny's Restaurant, Five Islands to celebrate its 15th anniversary with an expansion, which included an eat-in air-conditioned dining room.

July 1998, (Vol. 2, No.7) – 30 members of the Nova Scotia Rifle Association celebrated the 125th annual prize meet in Debert. Enid Lawrence, her son-in-law, Dean Brown and two grandchildren, Jessie Brown, 2 and Erin Brown, 8, perished in a June 22nd fire which destroyed her century old two family home in Masstown. Stan Corbett and Reg Myatt began installing 10 interpretive panels at the Bass River Heritage Park kiosk. Diane's Restaurant re-opened at its new location on the "action corner" of Wharf Road and Hwy #2.

August 1998, (Vol. 2, No.8) – Over 350 people took part in the Debert History Society first ever public tours of the underground fallout bunker in Debert. Pioneer cemeteries in Debert, Economy and Westchester have been or will be restored this summer. The Masstown Community Association presented Ken Russell, Shore Road with a certificate for the best overall in a gardening contest. About 126 people attended the Marsh family reunion in Five Islands. Economy Clam Festival attracts largest crowd ever. Four pages of photos of field days, festivals and family reunions in the area.

September 1998, (Vol. 2, No.9) – The Bass River Heritage Park dedicated in the honour of the late Charles Campbell was opened on September 12th. Kate Forbes, 16, daughter of Alex and Anne Forbes, Debert, wins javelin competition at the Royal Canada Legion national track and field competition in Prince George, BC. Twenty three members of the late Fraser Fisher family attended ceremonies on Parliament Hill, when officer Fisher's name was add to the list of Canada's peace officer killed on duty.

October 1998, (Vol. 2, No.10) – Byron M Delaney remembers his wartime memories in the first of a two part series. Eighteen pumpkin growers registered for the area's first ever, "Great Pumpkin Toss" at WCCS. The event was organized by Wayne
