Treasurer Jude McCall reported on the financial picture of the non-profit museum and the importance of continuing government support and local support.


Curator-Manager, Oralee O'Byrne, reported on the past season which saw the record number of visitors for the last 6 years.

Tribute to Johnny Cash at RECC June 27TH

You will recognize the face, the name, and the voice- Johnny Cash lives on in his younger brother, Tommy Cash, and he's coming to Truro on June 27 to take the stage at the Rath Eastlink Community Centre. Last month it was announced this was a 19+ show. That has been revised, the show is now for all ages.

Tommy will pay a special tribute to his brother, Johnny, through songs and story-telling including: Johnny Cash's greatest hits such as "Folsom Prison Blues", "Ring of Fire", "A Boy Named Sue", "I Walk the Line" and many more. The Special Tribute set for the Rath Eastlink Community Centre will be one of only two performances in Nova Scotia.

Tommy Cash was born in Arkansas, one of seven children in his family, and eight years after his brother, Johnny. He formed his first band in high school and enlisted in the Army after graduation.

He deejayed for American Forces Radio Network. After the Army, Tommy played with Hank Williams Jr., and later gained a record deal from Musicor in 1965.


Joining Tommy Cash on this special tribute will be the
