South Colchester Academy in Brookfield won \$20,000 in Phase 2 in Samsung Canada's first-ever *Solve for Tomorrow* competition. The students created a video about how the river by their school continues to flood their soccer field. They researched why this is happening and what can be done to fix it. The Brookfield school was one of 11 finalists in the nation-wide campaign, which offers a prize of \$50,000 and an amazing STEM (Science, Technology, Mathematics and Engineering) experience for their entire school. Voting ended on April 18th.

Nova Scotians are asked to share their views on proposed changes to the building code regulations regarding home-based businesses. The proposed changes would exempt home-based businesses from certain building code rules intended for commercial spaces if the business occupies less than 25 per cent — or 50 square metres of a residence. Businesses still have to meet all municipal zoning and land use bylaws. Nova Scotians are asked to submit their comments on the proposed changes by May 20th. Tidal energy testing is being carried out in Grand Passage on Digby Neck. A new research platform, the EcoSpray, a marine structure designed to gather data to verify the behaviour of floating tidal energy platforms and their moorings in high-energy turbulent tidal flows. The platform has been deployed in Grand Passage between Freeport and Westport, NS in the Outer Bay of Fundy. Key project partners include: Acadia University, Dynamic Systems Analysis Ltd., Fundy Tidal Inc., Dalhousie University and University of New Brunswick. The

Winning at the Canadian Cheese Awards is becoming a regular event for That Dutchman's Cheese Farm, Economy Nova Scotia. The awards are held every two years. In the 2016 competition held in Montreal on the weekend of April 16, That Dutchman's Cheese Farm walked away with the Best Blue cheese in Canada and Best Gouda in Canada.

Since 2004, the small rural Nova Scotia cheesemaker has won 6 Best in Canada awards and placed in the top three 15 more times.

2016 awards included Best Gouda Cheese in Canada for their Gouda, Old Growler. Old Growler is a premium aged Gouda that has a zesty, sharp flavour with a brittle texture.
