**RECREATION SERVICES Impacted by Covid-19**

Unfortunately Covid-19 has technically shut down all activities in Recreation services. It is unknown how long the ban will continue or how the provincial government's state of Emergency will possibly release some of the restrictions.

Implications have been department wide and include: Several of the programs scheduled to run have been cancelled (i.e. Learn to Skate, After school programs, Multisport, Step into Spring, SCA Fitness Room etc.); Cancelling the above programs and more has resulted in the layoff of 9 part time staff, as well as 10 contracted people (referees, instructors, fitness leaders and monitors).

All Municipal Parks have been closed following the mandate from the Provincial Government; All parking lots at trail heads have been closed and barricades and signage have been put in place. Consideration is being given for cancelling the upcoming Fun in the Sun Summer Day camps and Bike Week in early June. Those discussions are preliminary at this time but will increase and decisions made as we move forward in the coming weeks.

Next deadline for non-profit insurance program is October 23, 2020. The department will have updated information for all non-profit submission for the additions and deletions meeting. We are approaching all community events submissions as well to see if they will still be running their event in 2020.

open; The Gully Lake Trail is open.; The Cobequid Trail in the Town of Truro is closed. www.truro.ca' The rail trail section of the Cobequid Trail operated by the Municipality of Colchester is open (Lower Truro to Old Barns). www.colchester.ca

All trails in the Town of Stewiacke are closed. www.stewiacke.net/ and Roadway connector routes are open. Trails that are open, are open only for local use for exercise (i.e., if you can access them by walking, cycling, or wheelchair from your home). Parking lots used for accessing trails are closed. Driving to and parking at trailheads to access trails is not permitted. Gathering limits and social distancing must be followed.

We will be continuing upgrades and make improvements to our parks and trails as we go through this uncertain time. As a short update, we will be installing a bike repair station in Tatamagouche, fence posts at Anita Park and Rocky Ridge, tree planting in parks, netting in ball fields in North River and Pictou Road Ball field to name just a few safety issues and small projects that will happen prior to June.

The washroom in Nelson Park is being painted inside this spring and should be open to the public on or close to the opening of our parks (if we open them) on May 9. Parks staff will be starting a tree planting program in some of our parks this spring (starting soon) we have lost many trees over the past few winters and storms. Staff will be looking to start planting several trees in parks and green spaces.
