## Three Pronged Approach to Address Internet Issue

The Executive Committee met on March 24, 2023, covering four agenda items: Fiona Clean-up and Broadband Internet in open session; and a Public Security issue and a Personnel matter in closed session. **Fiona Clean-up:** A full report on the Fiona Clean-up discussion will be brought forward at an upcoming meeting.

**Broadband Internet:** Councillor Cooper raised concern regarding some inaccurate information being passed along to citizens reportedly by Bell employees. Previous to bringing this forward to the Executive Committee, the matter was discussed separately with the Mayor, CAO, Economic Development Officer and Municipal Solicitor. Further discussion was also held on concerns regarding NS

Power causing delays; this being a provincial initiative and advising them of the concerns; and preparing a direct communications piece regarding the project delay. Options to address the concerns were suggested by the Municipal Solicitor and the Executive Committee made following recommendation for Council consideration: "That Council approves a three-pronged approach to address the issue regarding Broadband Internet, with letters being written to Bell Media and the Premier, as well as issuing a communication piece regarding the project delay, as outlined by the Municipal Solicitor."

**Public Security and Personnel Matters:** These matters will be reported separately in Closed session.
