Tidal Observation Facility Nearing Completion

Rafe Construction Ltd, Parrsboro have been working full speed ahead during spring and summer and is now nearing completion of construction of the Tidal Power Observation and Interpretive Facility, which overlooks the technology test site near Black Rock, Minas Passage.

The site has the official name of Fundy Ocean Research Centre for Energy (FORCE). Those wish to follow the ongoing progress of the entire project are encouraged to visit: www.fundy-

During a visit to the site in mid-October, outside workers were busy installing shingles, installing windows and starting to construct the base to the observation deck. Inside crews were busy installing electrical wiring, framing up for interior windows. Large bundles of insulation lay waiting for place-

The approximately 3,500-

square foot FORCE facility will house a visitors centre with interpretive exhibits and a community room. The building is expected to finish construction by November, with interpretive materials constructed and installed

over the winter and spring. There is much more to the site than the visitor centre building. A significant amount of time and expense involved excavating the site for the number ditches, which contain the heavy transmission wires, which will be run along the ocean floor from the demonstration turbines to landfall and then onto the transmission lines to deliver electricity to consumers. Special wiring also leads into the facility to fulfill observation requirements during and beyond the initial testing phases of the turbines.

The building will be open to the public for the summer tourist season in 2011. Although total costs of the Observation Facility have not been released, FORCE will receive up to \$850,000 from ACOA to assist with construction costs for the facility.

At press time, employment levels at the facility for next summer are not known. It is anticipated full-time staff

will be supplemented with the addition of several college students during the peak summer tourist season. Staffing levels for 2011-2012 will be dependent upon the tourism and research demands
