Historic Sites

Along The Shore - Captain John Congdon and the Barque "Bedford"

The Shoreline Journal, in collaboration with the Colchester Historical Society Archives, have inaugurated an ongoing feature utilizing a combination of the digital "A. F. Church Maps" to pin point the circa 1875 location of a Colchester site of historical importance, and connect it to an archival photograph of that site, in that frame.

In March of 1885, Capt. John Congdon of Great Village, sailing the Clifton built ship "Bedford", from New York to Amsterdam, at mid ocean, had his vessel struck by lightning, and the ensuing fire got to the cargo in the hold.

Congdon had the hatches double tarped and covered to keep oxygen from the fire, and kept sailing.

The same storm disabled his rudder, so he jury-rigged a replacement, and continued sailing. A passing vessel, going in the other direction offered assistance, Congdon declined, said he had everything under control! Arriving at his destination, and uncovering the cargo they found much damage, and the cast iron knees of

the vessel were buckled, repaired, the vessel sailed again. A burned stave from one of the oil barrels, along with the captain's telescope still survive.

Ironically, after many dangerous years at sea, Captain Congdon died in a farming accident at nearby Lornvale.
