short films solicited from filmmakers in the region.

John Walker, writer, director and producer of the FIPA and Vancouver International Film Festival award-winning documentary, "A Drummer's Dream", was present for the Friday night screening of the Festival opener, along with

sound designer Alex Salter, both of whom engaged with the enthusiastic full-house crowd in an informative Q&A session.

Screenwriter acclaimed. MacDonald's "Faith Fraud and Minimum Wage", featuring many area actors, including Parrsboro native Don Allison, played on Saturday to a delighted audience, followed by the darkly comedic "Just Buried", written and directed by Chaz Thorne and filmed near Windsor, Nova Scotia. Foley artists on this film project were Krista Wells and Michael Fuller, both dedicated longtime supporters of the Hall's many cultural initiatives.

"Whirligig', directed by Chaz Thorne and filmed in Nova Scotia, closed the Festival on Sunday, with writer and co-producer Michael Amo in the house to share post-screening remarks.

New Brunswick filmmaker Nancy Lynch's "Hello Ladassia" was voted the audience favourite short film.

Of special importance to young Parrsboro horror filmmaker JB Tambeau was the opportunity to meet and converse with Josh MacDonald, writer of this season's international film horror/thriller hit, "The Corridor".

Plans are already underway for the 2012 Parrsboro Film Festival, with the possibility of the addition of workshops in lighting, sound, and film editing.
