Fire Prevention Presentation for Great Village Elementary

Every October is Fire Prevention month and this year's theme is "have two ways out". We got to talk to your children about this when we visited the Great Village Elementary School this month. They were an excited bunch of students when three of our five fire trucks rolled into the school yard.

The students are to be commended, first of all, for their response time on the fire drill. Once the alarm had sounded, all students had cleared the school on an orderly fashion in less than one minute. It was truly impressive to see how seriously they took this practice and the way they filed smartly to their meeting places.

After the fire drill, they all congregated in the gym for our presentation. They listened attentively to the information we offered and responded correctly to all the questions we asked. Then, they got to see some of our fire fighters wearing BAs so they would know what to expect if they ever needed us. And, three of them actually are our front line fire fighters

and could answer their questions about wearing the gear. One student actually got to try the BA on.

I would like to both say thanks and apologize to Captain Larry Kinsman who co-presented with me this year. He is usually in BA, however, this time was up front helping with the presentation. When I introduced him, I thought the kids might be impressed, so I asked them to guess how many years he has served as a firefighter. I should have known better, but a child in the front row said 200 years before I could make it multiple choice. (The correct answer is 45 yrs.)

After that, a tour of the trucks. They got to crawl over the pumper, look through the equipment unit and see the rescue. The jaws of life were the big draw on the rescue.

Since then, your child has brought home an information package. Please take the time to talk to your children about this information on a regular basis. Make sure, in the event of a fire, that they have two ways out and practice them regularly.
