


173rd Anniversary of Bass River United Baptist Church

Diligent River Bell Continues to Please

The bell in the photo accompanying this article has hung in the steeple of St John The Evangelist Anglican Church, Diligent River since 1890. The 250 lb bell was donated to the church by the Junior Mission Guild of the Church of Redeemer from Bryn Mawr in Philadelphia and has rung many times to announce special events even on New Year's Eve to the delight of the people of the village and bell ringers.

Under the ministry of Tor Byre, the church was deconsecrate and the building was offer for sale.

Valerie Smith and her husband, Frank purchased the building and began a year-long labour of carefully taking it down. During the demolition the bell became a focal point. Valerie was very firm that it should remain in the community.

The next step was the job of preparing the bell, where it would be safe, protected and visible.

With the cooperation of


Lorraine and Ron Maskill, it was decided to place it beside the Inuitesuk, which is in honour of Simon Gibbons and adjacent to the site of the former church. Gibbons was the founder of the church building.

Then people started helping. A cement foundation was

prepared and poured; bell supports were sandblasted and painted, then bolted into the foundation. At this point, Kennie Dowe took over. He sandblasted the wrought iron hanger and polished the bell, as it looks in the picture. He then brought the bell to its site and helped install it,

which was no small job.

The bell is installed in full view of any passers-by who are invited to ring it - to the enjoyment of all within listening range. The bell in its prominent location continues to be appreciated as it always has been.
