

## Fall Festival of Colours a Fantastic Celebration

The Wentworth community recently gave thanks not only to two splendid events at Ski Wentworth and at the Wentworth Recreation Centre, but also to the beautiful two Cobequid Mountain ranges which are close by and help give us the title "Fall Festival of Colours." The two ranges divide to allow a train railway track and the International Hostel with trails on one side, a level valley passage in the middle for roads, and on the opposite range Ski Wentworth developed by the Wilson family and others.

The two mountain ranges are even more beautiful than usual in autumn with the colours of red, orange, and gold from the deciduous trees especially at the top of the ranges and with more green added to the mixture from the coniferous trees down on the slopes.

Ski Wentworth is an added bonus to Wentworth as it provides exercise for health, more population with skiers and their homes, and jobs for the folks here. Their participation in the Fall Festival of Colours is wonderful for people of all ages. For two days they provided Chairlift Rides to the top of the mountain range with spectacular views, BBQ's outside, and a kids zone with petting zoo, pony rides, haystack playground, and an inflatable jumpy castle.

I visited the BBQ for hot dogs, cookies, crunchy oats and honey bars, and many kinds of drinks. Many people were lined up for the Chairlift Ride (I have done so at other times), and there were many children having fun. All this happened at this Cobequid Mountain range at the top and at the bottom, and it was a great experience with nature all around.

I was lucky to talk to Gregor Wilson, a descendant of the Wilsons who played and still play a large part in the running of Ski Wentworth. He sent me a photo from the Festival and his version of the event which I now quote: "Every Saturday and Sunday of Thanksgiving weekend, hik-

ers and nature lovers flock to the beautiful Wentworth Valley for hiking. Hikers can choose from guided hikes from the Old Wentworth Valley Schoolhouse, riding the chairlift at Ski Wentworth hiking and biking the Wentworth Youth Hostel trails or gentle trails along the Wallace River at the Wentworth Provincial Park.

This year 30 hikers joined the annual guided hike to High Head, which is also a fundraiser for the Old Wentworth Valley Heritage Schoolhouse. The colours were in perfect form with brilliant reds, yellows and oranges on full display.

Butch and Debbie Atkinson lead the group up a direct route, enjoyed the views of the colourful forests far below from High Head, and then took a meandering route along the Nordic ski trails and down the ski hill, complete with more breathtaking views across and up the valley.

Ski Wentworth had its busiest Fall Colours single day ever on Saturday with over 2600 people enjoying a chair lift to the top of the mountain and more views on the hike back down. A chance of showers that did not materialize kept the crowds smaller on Sunday, although the colours and the temperature were perfect for hiking and taking in nature's beauty."

I will add information about High Head, which is the highest peak in the Cobequid Mountain for the Wentworth area. On a sunny day, people can see across this area down to the Northumberland Strait. Some people have said that on a sunny day, even the Confederation Bridge to PEI has been seen.

A two minutes car drive, with the colours everywhere in sight, shows another event is happening on Saturday at the Wentworth Recreation Centre. People come for a tasty pork supper and have fun talking and getting acquainted.

I was lucky to talk to Sonya Seymour, President of the Wentworth Firemen's Recreation Centre, who next day sent me her report which
