Grade 6'ers Can Learn New Instrument

This year, the Grade Six students at CCJHS have an opportunity to learn how to play a new instrument in their music class. They can choose to play the flute, trombone, clarinet trumpet, baritone, euphonium, or tuba. If they decide to continue with the program, they can try the french horn, saxophone, percussion, oboe, or bassoon.

There is also an afterschool band program on Tuesdays with Mrs. Hartlen, CCJHS's music teacher, from 2 to 3:30. The school has some instruments students can borrow, or they can rent from one of the local music stores. If anyone has instruments they no longer need, CCJHS also accepts donations! A generous grant of \$5,000 from the Music Counts Canada program provided a third of the school's instruments. Additionally, the country singer Charlie A'cort donated guitar strings to the program and the MacLennon Foundation was generous with its support.

Mrs. Hartlen is also directing the school choir *Ursa Major* for the second year in a row. They perform songs from many different styles of music, including pop, classical, music in other languages, as well as performances for specific occasions such as Remembrance Day. Practices are on Thursdays from 2 to 3:15 after school. They will be having a holiday concert with the band members and anyone else who would like to perform on Tuesday, December 12th at 7pm.

CCJHS's cross country team performed very well at the Regionals in Antigonish on October 16th. Members Colby Burnham and Bailey Wolfe advanced to Provincials, which was held on October 23 in

Halifax. Congratulations to everyone who participated!

The Terry Fox run was held on October 4. Students who donated a dollar received a piece of duct tape, which was used to tape the principal, Mr. MacPherson, to the wall of the school. Overall, 1000 dollars was raised for the Terry Fox foundation.

Pash Swearing-in Later

Mayor Christine Blair was not able to hold the swearing in ceremonies for councillor-elect, Robert Pash at council's meeting on October 26th, because the time allowed for an appeal had not passed following the October 21st municipal by-election for District 9.

If the original election results stand without an appeal or application for a re-count, it is expected he will be sworn in prior to council's presenta-

tion session on November 6th. If there is a further delay, he will be sworn in at council's committee meeting on November 16th.

The by-election was held following the resignation of Doug MacInnes, who was first elected to council in 2012, when he defeated incumbent councillor Robert White. White reoffered, but was defeated by new comer Pash in a tally of 379-240.

Remembrance Day Services

Councillor Taggart asked if another councillor could assist with representing the municipality during Remembrance Day services. In his district he has services in Bass River, Great Village, both at 11 am and Londonderry and Five Islands at 2:30 pm in the afternoon. He needed someone to cover Bass River as he alternates between Bass River and Great Village and this is the year to be at Great Village. He's committed to Londonderry, so Mayor Blair offered to handle Five Islands and Deputy Mayor Masters will travel to Bass River.

Councillor Gregory asked for approval to attend an upcoming Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) conference in Ottawa in 2018, because he's interested in the

topic, Sustainable Communities, the main theme of the conference. His request was approved.

Mayor Blair referenced a special presentation at Colchester Historeum when the first kilt with the new Colchester Tartan, which was purchased by the municipality will be presented to the Historeum for display and will be accompanied by certificates of authenticity.

Council approved realignment of the Capital Budget process changing the schedule from August to February beginning February 2018 and on an ongoing basis. Staff have been directed to communicate the scheduling change to any external Agencies, Boards or Commissions which could be impacted by the scheduling change.
