Develop Nova Scotia to Lead Internet Strategy

Their report from the August 21st stakeholders meeting informed council, Develop Nova Scotia will help connect communities and create vibrant places that strengthen the province's economy — they will encourage investment throughout Nova Scotia by creating sustainable places. Develop Nova

Scotia will be expanding their board from that of the Waterfront Development Corporation to create a governance model that will represent the province. Working with the Regional Enterprise Networks may be an option to support provincial-wide staff representation.

One of Develop Nova Scotia's responsibilities will be to oversee and lead the

implementation strategy to bring better internet services to under-serviced communities and businesses across Nova Scotia. To support this important work, the Province of Nova Scotia has created an Internet Funding Trust worth \$190 Million.

Develop Nova Scotia provided an overview of the recently completed middle mile and final mile strategies,

which make recommendations of how to connect a minimum of 95% of households in Nova Scotia to high speed Internet. Over their first 90 days, Develop Nova Scotia will work to develop a model and strategy of how this money might be disbursed to reach the goal of connecting more than 95% of Nova Scotia households to high speed internet.

Bliss Brown Dedicated 40 years to Research

Bliss Brown has turned 40 years of research into "Once By Sea, Once By Land" is a three volume 1,100 page collection of genealogy and history based upon the ancestry and descendants of Elijah Brown (31 March 1780 - 30 September 1855). The story

The detailed research has its beings in England in 1635.

Brown is pleased he was able to complete printing in early fall as he believes many families may want to purchase a family set as Christmas Gifts. Even though the genealogy dates back to 1635, the Cumberland connection enables families to trace their ancestry through many decades since the arrival of Elijah Brown and wife, Henrietta (Cannon) Brown in Parrsboro in 1802.

Author Bliss Brown now lives in Amherst, but was born in Springhill. He retired after 40 years employed in the health care industry. He is married with two children and volunteers for the Mapleton Cemetery Company and the Cumberland County Genealogical Society.

His 40 years of research evolved into "Once By Sea, Once By Land", a three volume 1100 page collection of genealogy and history based upon the ancestry and descendants of Elijah Brown (31 March 1780 - 30 September 1855). The story

begins in England 1635, to Boston, then New Hampshire and Maine before his marriage 1802 in Parrsboro, Nova Scotia.

The families of Elijah and Henrietta (Cannon) Brown spread across Colchester and Cumberland counties of Nova Scotia, Westmorland County of New Brunswick and Elgin County, Ontario. The wide span of family names include Siddall, Piers, Carter, Welton, Hughes, Fife, Brundage, Jeffers, Skidmore, Kennedy, Tabor, Edwards, Pettigrew, Thompson, Allen, Canning, Harrison, Hoeg, Bird, Atkinson, Canning, Bowden, Dowe, Quinn and of course, Brown; and so many more.

Pages also include over 300 photographs and numerous obituaries. Authored by Bliss Brown, after more than 40 years of research. The three volume set sells for \$65.00, plus shipping.
