Amendments to the Denturists Act

Changes to the Denturists Act will allow denturists to place removable dentures over implants while working as part of an implant team. This is something denturists are trained to do, but currently only dentists are able to provide this service in Nova Scotia. This skill is part of the curriculum at all three accredited schools of denturism in Canada. A denturist is a specialized dental-care professional who is trained and works exclusively with dentures and denture patients; there are 38 denturists registered to practice in Nova Scotia. A New Era of Rural Broadband

Pictou County is moving forward on a project which will bring fast and affordable high-speed internet to the community. In partnership with Nova Communications, a division of ROCK Networks, and a consortium of best-in-class partners, Nokia, Plexus, WesTower, i-Valley, and NCS, the Municipality of Pictou County is positioned to provide internet connectivity where none has existed before. This Open Access Network model succeeds where traditional telecom models fail. It will also be opening up areas of innovation with Smart City and IoT capabilities. The High-Speed Internet Project has been the top priority of Council for the last three years and is a major milestone for all residents and businesses in rural Pictou County. It will be one of the first municipal units to construct, own and control its own high-speed Internet system. This will allow individuals and businesses to live and operate almost anywhere in Pictou County's rural landscape with all the communications advantages of larger urban centres. The Municipality of Pictou County has committed \$25 million to building the network ensuring residents and businesses in rural areas have access to the best high-speed Internet available. Population Reaches All-time High

Nova Scotia's population grew by 11,895 residents, or 1.24 per cent, reaching a high of 971,395 as of July 1, 2019. Nova Scotia's population is at a new all-time high thanks to the number of immigrants and people from other provinces who are choosing to make their homes here.

Over the last year, 6,393 immigrants settled in Nova Scotia. At the same time, the net migration to Nova Scotia from other provinces grew to 3,306.
