The Amherst and Area Chamber of Commerce hosted the annual Small Business Awards Gala on October 22nd, which saw four local businesses being honoured for their contribution to the local business community. Emcee for the evening gala was David March.

Attendees and award nominees were treated to an interesting address by Patrick Manifold, Nova Scotia Media and Marketing. On a lighter note, door prize for the evening was two

tickets to the Amherst & Area Chamber of Commerce AGM scheduled for April 23rd 2020 and was won by Mr. Terry Farrell.

Cumberland residents and business owners have several reasons to be proud and has a lot going for it, even though they sometimes feel isolated being located in the most northeast corner of the province. Even though they have a reputation for national recognition in many areas.

Resource industries are important even though recent decades there has

been a lot of out-migration from rural areas. Stastics Canada forecasting indicate rural areas across Canada will be on a growth plateau and will show growth in excess of 7% over the next decade.

Cumberland County produces 50% of all wild blueberries grown in Nova Scotia; 80% of maple sugar taps in Nova Scotia are found in Cumberland County and there is several strengths in Agriculture. Cumberland County is the second largest county in Nova Scotia and is home to 14% of all Nova Scotia farms

with 30% of all Class II soils in the province.

These are the behind the scenes data, which gives Jonathan McClelland the drive to push and enhance the Cumberland Business Connector.

The kick-off announcement of the "Cumberland Business Challenge" couldn't have been made to a more receptive and understanding audience. Early in the evening, Mr. Jonathan McClelland - CEO of the Cumberland Business Connector took to the podium

Award Nominee - Tysons' Fine Minerals

When Helen Tyson was asked how Tysons' Fine Minerals was born, she told us "It grew out of a joint love my husband and I share for geology - especially mineral specimens, which we collect as well as sell." Ms. Tyson and her husband Rod have operated Tysons' Fine Minerals in Parrsboro for over ten years. In discussing their move from Edmonton to Parrsboro Ms. Tyson shared with us that it has been very good for them. Saying that when they arrived, they knew they wanted to be a part of the community, not just live and work here. And that as Nova Scotia is such a desirable

vacation destination, they have had numerous people let them know that they had planned their vacation specifically to visit Tysons' Fine Minerals.

When asked about their mission Ms. Tyson shared, "Collecting and preserving Canada's mineral heritage

since 1975." In expanding on how that plays out, she added, "We prospect, develop and market Canadian mineral specimens." As Rod Tyson is a world-renowned professional geologist that certainly rings true.

Above I had mentioned that when they moved here

the Tysons committed to being part of the community of Parrsboro. Having seen the list of organizations, projects, and community efforts they are a part

of, it's clear that they have been true to their word. And regardless of if it is Mr. Tyson, Ms. Tyson or Tysons' Fine Minerals, they are all immersed in the community
