Province Improves Financing Tools for Farming, Seafood, Forestry Businesses

The Province is supporting the growth of farming, seafood and forestry businesses through improvements at provincial loan boards. The changes will provide more flexibility to both new and existing clients and quicker access to capital, particularly for debt of more than \$5 million. Amended regulations for the Nova Scotia Farm Loan Board, Nova Scotia Timber Loan Board, and Nova Scotia Fisheries and Aquaculture Loan Board will provide more flexibility in security requirements for loans and better options for lump sum payments and loan deferrals for growing businesses. The changes also provide more consistency across the sectors. "Our loan program is helping strengthen the backbone of our rural coastal communities," said Fisheries and Aquaculture Minister Kent Smith. "By providing access to affordable financing, we're supporting fish harvesters, processors, and small businesses that are vital to local economies." The loan boards finance all aspects of the three resource sectors, including the purchase of equipment, construction of new buildings and vessels, and buying quotas or licences. The changes better meet the needs of Nova Scotia businesses and help them to be more competitive. "Nova Scotia's forestry sector brings more than \$2 billion a year into our economy and supports about 6,000 jobs around the provinces, especially in rural communities.
