by the Conservatives on April 30th following Casey's resig-On September 12th at a Jim Burrows, a dairy farmer from Green Oaks overcame a bid from Tracy Parsons, candidate in the 2008 federal election, to win the hearts of Liberals for the upcoming byelection.

On September 30th Jim Austin will be acclaimed at the NDP nomination meeting on September 30th, 7:30 p.m. at the Truro Fire Hall in a meeting open to the public. North River's Karen Olsson, who finished second in last year's Federal election, was prepared to run again, but has stepped aside to make way

for Mark Austin. In early 2009, Incumbent Bill Casey announced he would not be re-offering in the next Federal Election. He subsequently announced his resignation from Parliament to become the Senior Inter-Governmental Affairs Representative for Nova Scotia in Ottawa.


On April 30, 2009 Scott Armstrong was confirmed as the next Conservative Party candidate in the riding. Armstrong is a supporter of Bill Casey, having served as Campaign Manager to Casey in 2000 and 2004. He is the current president of the provincial Progressive Conservative Party.

Jim Hnatiuk is the leader of the Christian Heritage Party of Canada, having assumed that post in November 2008. Hnatiuk joined the Christian Heritage Party in 2002 and has run as a candidate for the party in Nova Scotia in the Kings-Hants 2004, South Shore-St Margarets, 2006 and Kings-Hants in 2008 federal elections.

Party Green leader Elizabeth May had said she was interested in running in the by-election, but has since announced she will be running in the riding of British Columbia's - Saanich-Gulf Islands

This riding was created as "Cumberland—Colchester North" in 1966 from Cumberland and Colchester— Hants ridings. It consisted of the county of Cumberland and the northern part of the county of Colchester, including the town of Truro. It was abolished in 1976 when it was merged with the remainder of Colchester County into "Cumberland—Colchester" riding.
