For a spectacular view of the colourful leaves, ride the chairlift to the top of

Wentworth Mountain. It's one of the most amazing views you'll see of the Valley. Get your exercise walking back down the mountain. Please note: this is a one way trip only. There is no transportation down the mountain. Its recommended participants are in good physical condition, as the hike down can be physically demanding.

There is no mountain bike access. Sorry, no pets allowed on the chairlift.

Ski Wentworth General Manager Leslie Wilson says the Fall Festival of Colours continues to grow in popularity. "We had another great turnout last season," said Wilson. "It has become part of a family Thanksgiving tradition. You see the same folks back with the kids and grandkids. It's a great, active way to spend the day with the family in a beautiful setting.

The chairlift runs from 10am to 4pm. Cost is \$15 per person or \$40 for a family (maximum 5). There's a barbeque at the base of the mountain at noon.

If you'd like some more direction to your day, why not take a guided hike to High Head? Depart 10am sharp from the Old Valley School House on Barclay Road for an 11km (three hour) hike to High Head. This is an intermediate level hike. This is a free tour, however, donations are gladly accepted for the Old Valley School House.


