Some of us might not be able to remember much from our early childhood years but Elizabeth Dillman-Hutchinson says these years hold some of her best memories, so much so, she felt a call to return to Nova Scotia and the community of Bass River.

Elizabeth moved out west after the age of twenty and worked in the social sector for eighteen years as a Live Skills Coach, Employment Counsellor and Services Practitioner. She always kept in touch with her Bass River Elementary School Grade Primary /One teacher Mary Sharpe, until she passed away. Elizabeth lived in Alberta and then Williams Lake, BC. She eventually found herself burnt out and left her job, then sold her house and moved into a travel trailer. She says she had no plans to write a book but one morning she awoke hearing the words "God are you listening" in her mind and decided to write these words down, thinking would record the moment.

"I began to write, and continued non-stop for eight hours. Every day after, I honoured this call to write, first thinking it was therapy for myself, but later I realized it was much bigger than that," she says with a smile, "And I continued to write every day for five weeks, until it was finished."

The main title of the book God, Are You Listening?, was an easy choice, reflecting the start to her journey and the subtitle Free Yourself from What is Holding You Back helps reference the self-help nature of the book.

Elizabeth Hutchinson hopes to provide the inspiration one needs to find meaning and purpose in their life by sharing her own story and the process she undertook to arrive at "heart consciousness".

This nondenominational spiritual self-help book is intended for people of all faiths, religions and belief systems, as well as nonbelievers.

The book was released by Turning Stone Press in March, 2012 and Elizabeth has been on somewhat of a book tour/promotion across Canada ever since, with a book signing at Coles in Truro, on Sept. 8th.

During Elizabeth's many years in the social sector she found people in crisis were often looking for an immediate fix and it was not until sometime afterwards that they would often find themselves stuck in the victimization or tragedy. It is then they would realize not everything could be fixed. She hopes her book will help people to release the negative energy holding them back.

The book is written with a review at the end of each chapter, making it suitable for group study in addition to individual reading and the author says it can be helpful for all ages."I was surprised to be contacted from people in their 70's and 80's, who had read the book and who said they had finally been released from the pain they had been holding on to. There are all kinds of pain we must learn to work through," says Elizabeth. "Men have also found the book an easy read. The practical techniques are very easy

God, Are You Listening? Free Yourself from What is Holding You Back is filled with practical real life stories, from real people and how they have overcome life's challenges. "I am not promising, if you follow the steps outlined in the book, life will be perfect," says Elizabeth. "We will always encounter challenges, but our response can be different. It is really up to the individual to put forth the effort."

While writing the book, Elizabeth initially thought this was something people could turn to for help after a crisis but now she is finding many people are finding it very helpful during times of crisis. "It is also a great "prevention" book," she says, "especially for the youth. A good way for them to gain skills to help them deal with challenges life can through at them."

As for settling down any time soon, Elizabeth says it is too soon to tell. She has been enjoying spending time with family and friends such as Jim and Teresa Tanner and Keith and Darlene Smith and visiting areas in Bass River where her father Carl Dillman used to work in the logging camps. "I guess we will travel until is feel like we are done," she laughs.


Bob White Candidate for Councilor - District 9
