Elderhostel Sails into Port Greville

2015 has seen an increase in tourism, at least, at The Age of Sail Museum in Port Greville.

"This summer our stats are the best in the last 6 years" says Curator Oralee O'Byrne "We have had a great number of visitors from nearby and around the world. Whether in part to the fall of the Canadian dollar or an increase in awareness of the area I can't be sure but I can say it is not simply a huge influx of Americans."

In fact visitors have come from as far as Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong as well as the UK, Europe, the US and Canada. The museum is constantly adding to their collection and working to add to and improve the site so there is appeal for repeat visitations. "Response to the centre is highly favourable and we strive to keep up our standards."

Ongoing work on the archival collections and storage set up continues. The museum is actively collecting archival content relative to the lumbering and ship-building history and local communities. If you have something you wish to donate contact the Curator at 902-348-2030 or 902-254-2079. A new boat deck around the existing mast has been built as an aesthetic feature with positive response.

An expanded Memorial/war display is also receiving very positive response. "In honor of the 100 yr anniversary of WWI and 75 for WWII we have expanded our display. Items have been loaned by the



Army Museum of Halifax and many local residents have made donations including photos for the wall of honour." Said curator Oralee O'Byrne "We will happily display photos of any of our local vets whether from as far back as WWI to those in the forces today." The museum also holds a free Armed Forces Luncheon every June for our vets.

Many groups have made The Age of Sail a stop this year including school groups, Elderhostel's, motorcycle rallies and bicycle rallies. One of the latest groups was the Elderhostel organized by The Fundy Geological Museum. The 17

participants came from across the US from California to Boston Mass. and many points in between.

On Sept 26 a group of 50+ International Students will visit the museum, one of the biggest groups of the year. The centre is also happy to see the use of their centre by local groups for meetings and the start of workshops at the centre. The Museum has space for use for a variety of purposes. If you would like more information please contact the Curator.

The museum and café are open until the 18th of October 10-6 except for Tuesdays and Wednesday.
