


Redeveloping Exhibit Gallery and Lobby in Progress at the Historeum

Pre-installation activities in the lobby and main gallery began in late August and into September. Wall surfaces had to be smoothed and two new flat doors were installed providing a continuous surface with adjacent walls so pictorial wall graphics can be added.

The bilingual text for murals and banners is finalized as well as detail for the exhibit binders. Artifacts selected for exhibit cases are being prepared and adjustments to lighting is underway. Most of the on-site installation is scheduled to take place from October 5th to 24th.

The AV Mini Theatre and sound is scheduled to be installed on October 7th to 9th. By late October you will see a transformed gallery reflecting Life in the Heart of Nova Scotia through an interesting presentation of graphics, artifacts, lighting and banners.

The entrance lobby and main exhibit gallery will become a focal point but other specialized stories will be shown in the DeWolfe Room and on the 3rd floor.

It was a beautiful hot day and our members had a great time handing out fire hats and tattoos and of course letting all the children play with the fire house.
