

A View from Dwane Mellish's Perspective

Dwane Mellish has been associated with fire brigade's for 35 years and has been chief of the Bible Hill Fire Brigade for nine years. He sees the most pressing problem for his brigade is to recruit and retain volunteer firefighters who are able to make the commitment to this very important emergency service.

He notes, "training requirements have increased both in level of required training (complexity) as well as the time required by volunteers. The risks that emergency responders face now can be significantly more complex currently compared to when I joined the fire service."

New home construction and furniture within new houses is much more flammable and will flashover and/or collapse in a much shorter time. These type of fires are much more dangerous to the residents and the responding firefighters".

When asked for his perspective what is the number one concern you have with respect to homeowners/ businesses and their ability to be proactive in regards to fire prevention, Mellish responded, "Residential fires are by far the most common. Kitchen fires, many times caused by unattended cooking, are the leading cause of these residential fires".

I asked Chief Mellish in five years from now, what do you think will be a concern of Fire Departments and their ability to help communities be safe?

His response was "Availability and retention of trained volunteer emergency responders will continue to be a challenge for the volunteer fire service. As demographics change, with our aging population, the fire service membership is also aging. The younger generation is more mobile and tend to be less committed to a community for the long term. The volunteer fire service must change to make it attractive to the next generation to provide this essential emergency service to our communities".

The Bible Hill Fire Brigade has a total of thirty member, three Mutual Aid members, who are members in good

standing in other Brigades/Departments within the County of Colchester, who work in Bible Hill. They are available to the Bible Hill Brigade during day time hours when normally there is a shortage of members to respond to emergencies.

Brigade members are recognized with a dinner in December as well as the annual Awards banquet in April of each year.

Near the end of the interview I asked Chief Mellish, What are you particularly proud of, as your time spent as a Chief of the Department? His response was, "I am proud of the progress in our Brigade

during my time as Fire Chief. Progress in infrastructure including a major expansion of the station (2008) as well as new equipment including a pumper truck as well as a new utility vehicle equipped for RIT (Rapid Intervention team) to assist and protect fellow firefighters at major fires. I am most proud of the joint efforts by all our members to improve their level of skills through training and practical experience".


