NOBL is one of 13 CBDC's in Nova Scotia

Northern Opportunities for Business Limited (NOBL) is part of the Canada Business Development Corporation (CBDC) network of 41 offices throughout Atlantic Canada with provincial associations operating in each province. In Nova Scotia there are 13 individual CBDC's operating under the umbrella of Nova Scotia Association of CBDC's.

Northern Opportunities for Business Limited (NOBL) was formed in 1986 as Pictou County Business Opportunities Limited. Since the beginning of 1997 NOBL has operated in the three Counties of Antigonish, Pictou, and Colchester run by a volunteer Board of Directors supported by three Investment Committees (one for each County) and a six-member professional Staffing complement.

NOBL's mandate was set at that time and continues today and includes: To actively pro-

mote, encourage, and assist economic development in our geographic area; To encourage the concept of small business development as a method of creating local employment opportunities; To encourage employment diversity and stability in the community through self-employment, individual ownership, partnerships, corporations, co-operatives, worker collectives, non-profit organizations, job sharing, part and full-time work or any other appropriate structure; To administer funding received from government and private sources from which the Company will provide direct financial assistance to selected business projects in our geographic area, in a manner and under terms as may be established from time to time; and to co-operate with all existing private and public agencies with similar objects in an effort to provide solutions to community problems

and to avoid duplication of services.

CBDC/NOBL has many partners in the business support arena. We share many clients with ACOA and Service Canada. We work with the RDA's and Nova Scotia Business Inc. to find potential entrepreneurs as well as businesses looking for financial assistance. And we have recently signed an agreement with the Business Development Bank of Canada which gives our joint clients more speedy turnaround on their financing decisions.

Services to business is varied with an offering of a variety of services to business, including small business loans, counselling, planning, loans and financial help. The NS Association of CBDCs is a network of autonomous, not for profit corporations. CBDCs work in cooperation with government and the private sector to meet the needs of small businesses.

In Nova Scotia, the Association is an umbrella organization that works on behalf of all CBDCs in Nova Scotia. The Association employs two full time staff at its office in Elmsdale.


