

Norm Rafuse Response to South Cumberland News Questionnaire

Why did you decide to run for District 13, Parrsboro?

I decided to run because many, many people asked me. I think that I am the best and most qualified candidate for the job, having been elected last year by the residents of Parrsboro in a majority vote. My heart is in this area and I want to be a strong voice representing issues that Parrsboro residents feel are important.

What is the most serious / pressing problem facing Parrsboro residents?

Our most serious problem is employment, or a lack of it.

What needs to be accomplished to improve the economy of Parrsboro and area?

We need more industry in our area to keep our residents employed so they don't move on and resettle in other places. Industries like tourism, farming, forestry, fishing, retail, etc. need a boost... they need a strong voice to back them up in council and that is what I intend upon doing. We have so much to offer in Parrsboro!

How will the new \$-multi-million sewer project help the town?

This sewer project will bring Parrsboro into the 21st century, it is long overdue. On an environmental stand point we will no longer be polluting our harbor or the Bay of Fundy; residents and visitors will be able to swim at First Beach knowing that the water they are swimming in is clean and safe. The plant itself will no doubt be staffed by our public works crew. With the plant in place building lots that owners were not able to build upon due to restrictions on septic installation, will now (for the most part) have the option of being serviced by our new water treatment facility.

What talents / experience will you bring to council to help the area?

I have lived here for 23 years. I built a successful construction business from the ground up which has been operational for 40 years. I know the value of a dollar and I am no stranger to hard work. I am a strong believer in supporting local businesses and I do so by sourcing material locally. I am involved in my community through several boards which I sit on and those who work with me on these would attest that I am a strong contributor. Last year I won the majority vote because the people of Parrsboro believed in and voted for me. I hope to be able to do that again during this election.

Why should Parrsboro residents vote for you?

a: Anyone who knows me would realize I get straight to the point. Being in business for 40 years I am most certainly reliable having attended every council meeting since being elected in 2015 I am very involved in the politics here in Parrsboro. Sandy Graham's Response to South Cumberland News Questionnaire

Why did you decide to run for District 13, Parrsboro?

I am running because, like the other candidates, I believe that I can make a difference. I also believe that my particular background, perspectives and personality make me a good "fit" for such a role. We have to put economic development at the top of the agenda in the coming years, an agenda that embraces the special attributes of our community, including its beauty, and unique heritage, arts and culture.

What is the most serious / pressing problem facing Parrsboro residents?

A lack of long term integrated or "strategic" planning is, in my view, the most serious and pressing problem for Parrsboro residents. This is central to the question of the infrastructure needed to maintain services and programs in the present, and to attract tourists, and new residents and businesses to the area. We need a cohesive plan - a blueprint - that will embrace all the challenges and opportunities ahead for the next twenty years. The seeds for that growth can be planted now.

What needs to be accomplished to improve the economy of Parrsboro and area?

Like all Nova Scotia, and especially rural areas, Parrsboro & area is seeing an outmigration of youth. And like most of Cumberland County (excepting Amherst), the population is declining by about 10% per decade. We have to decide collectively, and strategically, that we will be more than a "retirement community". We have to act quickly to attract families and businesses, and support those businesses to the extent that we can.

How will the new \$-multi-million sewer project help the town?

A major (and overdue) upgrade to our infrastructure like this will enhance our ability to attract new residents and businesses, as well as tourists. If planned properly, it could be part of a package development that would include a waterfront development of the aboiteau, the benefits including various kinds of recreation, increased biodiversity and health of the ecosystem, tourism, and a much improved visual appearance.

What talents / experience will you bring to council to help the area?
