## Mental Health Offices to Get New Home

The former Bargain House building at 856 Prince Street, which has been empty for nearly five years, will soon be the new home of the Colchester East Hants Branch of the Canadian Mental Health Association. Susan Henderson, Executive Director, outlined details to Colchester councillors and staff at a presentation meeting on September 12th.

Henderson said the plan is to bring all the services offered by the branch into one unit to make a "community of wellness". Currently the various services offered by the Colchester East Hants branch are housed in different locations. The services include: Community Outreach Program; Mental Health Recovery Support Group; The Club; Willow House and Independent Living Support Program.

The new facility will permit room for expansion and to increase services to the area. Other things include Soup Café, Food with thought and Youth Outreach Program.

Staff and Board of Directors have been able to develop a plan to purchase the building. The branch has been able to secure a tradition \$2-Million mortgage for purchase and renovations, but need to undertake a massive fund raising campaign to reduce the overall liability and

make the monthly payments more affordable.

The building will include: Soup Café, Friendship Club Kitchen, retail space, programming room, private counseling, training room, boardroom, staff room, green space and a large area at the back for future development.

The board of directors and staff have developed a comprehensive program offering several levels of contribution, which can be made in one installment or over 3-5 years. Starting off at the top building dedication is \$250,000. Several room dedications are available ranging from \$50,000 - \$100,000 for SOUP dining area, SOUP and Friendship Club Kitchen, Retail Area, Private Meeting Room, Independent Living Support Room, Youth Outreach Space, Community Connections Office, Boardroom, Training Room and Reception Area.

A major donor wall will be erected which will be erected, which in addition to the foregoing, other levels are available: Diamond, \$25,000 - \$49,999; Platinum, \$15,000 - \$24,999; Gold, \$5,000 - \$14,999; Silver, \$2,500 - \$4,999; Bronze, #1,500-\$2,499 and Champion, \$1,000 - \$1,499.00.

## Applications Now Open for Agencies, Boards and Commissions

Nova Scotians from all parts of the province are needed to serve on the province's 155 agencies, boards and commissions. Applications are now being accepted through a new online application system. All Nova Scotia residents are eligible to apply for these volunteer positions.

Nova Scotians can apply to serve on a variety of agencies, boards and commissions, including library, hospital and police advisory boards, colleges and boards of self-regulating health professions, the Film Classification Board, the Legal Aid Commission, the Council on Mi'kmaq Education, and the Minimum Wage Review Committee.

Applicants are assessed on their skills and qualifications, taking the needs of the individual agency, board or commission into account. Applications will be considered for both current and upcoming vacancies. Typically, appointees are reimbursed for expenses, and, in some cases, paid a small stipend for their services.

The Government of Nova Scotia has an Employment Equity Policy. Applications from Aboriginal people, African Nova Scotians and other racially visible people, persons with



disabilities, women and members of other employment equity groups are welcomed. Applicants are encouraged to self-identify when applying for appointment.
