## \$123,654 to Improve Food Security

Food banks and other local food organizations across Canada are facing an increased demand

for their services, and added pressure from shortages in donations and volunteers. Now more than ever, they need continued support to offer the crucial services Canadians rely upon to feel safe and healthy.

On September 20th, Lenore Zann, Member of Parliament for Cumberland-Colchester visited Cumberland

YMCA in Amherst where she announced \$123,654 from the Government of Canada to improve food security for Cumberland and Colchester residents facing social, economic and health impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The funds were distributed between: Chignecto Central Regional Center for Education; YMCA Association of Cumberland; Amherst Food Assistance Network Association; Colchester Community Support Society; Neighbours Helping Neighbours; Oxford & Area Food Bank Association; Parrsboro & Area Food Bank Society; Pugwash Open Hamper Food Bank; Salvation Army Family Services (Truro); Salvation Army Springhill Community Church; Springhill Community and Family Services; Truro Community and Family Services and Elevate-HER Mental Health Support Services Canada.

This funding is part of the \$100 million Emergency Fund for food security announced

by Prime Minister Trudeau in April to position food banks and local food organizations

early in the pandemic to respond to increased community needs.

## 2020 Wilson Family Scholarship Recipients



Elmsdale ESSO, NS


