## Future of Health Care in West Colchester

There was a great turnout for the information session on Health Care Services in Bass River & West Colchester held on Sept. 21st at the Victoria Hall. Community members listened to the presentation by members of the NS Health panel and then took part in

further discussion.

In 2019, the West Colchester Health Centre lost the services from its two doctors and physician recruitment has had its challenges ever since.

The West Colchester Medical Society (WCMS) currently oversees the operations of the West Colchester Community

Health Centre with funding from Dept. of Health and Wellness, two Nova Scotia Health Practitioners and community fundraising and donations.


The Health Centre serves the area along the shore from Five Islands to Glenholme with 850 patients shared between the two nurse practi-

tioners, leaving 628 patients on the Need a Family Practice Registry in this area.

The NS Health Authority has worked with the West Colchester Medical Society to develop two proposed clinic models going forward. These were based on the guiding principles of building sustainable, predictable health services based on community population and need; building on the strengths of the existing resources; considering community and provider input; collaboration with NS Health, WCMS and the community, consideration of the rural context and geographical location and seamless transition and care continuity to be not only maintained but strengthened.

The proposed new health services model looks at a

## BDC launches \$500 Million Thrive Venture Fund and Lab for Women

BDC announced on September 21, the launch of its \$500 million Thrive Venture Fund and Lab for Women during the Elevate Festival in Toronto. Building on the success of BDC Capital's Women in Technology (WIT) Venture Fund, launched in 2017, Thrive will be the largest investment platform of its kind in the world, supporting Canadian women-led businesses for them to grow and have a lasting impact on the economy.

The Thrive platform is comprised of three distinct components, providing a comprehensive approach to addressing barriers faced by women, be it through direct early-stage investment, strategic investment in women-led and focused funds, or emerging models for providing equity investments for women-led businesses in the earliest stages of development, all while continuing to develop a more robust and sustainable ecosystem for all.

More specifically, the platform will be made

up of:

**\$300 million direct investment fund** - seeking to partner with promising women entrepreneurs building Canadian technology companies at seed and Series A/B stages. Using the same investment thesis as the WIT Venture Fund, Thrive Venture Fund will remain sector agnostic and will continue to invest in companies with strong growth and scalable market potential, that bring together the right innovation, team, and resources to transform today's markets.

**\$100 million lab** - a new initiative designed to develop innovative equity investment models for women-led companies with promising business models and growth potential, which may not necessarily be on a traditional path to securing venture capital investment. The initial focus of Thrive Lab will be to deliver its unique offering in collaboration with ecosys-
