Local Solutions are Key to the Recovery

During the federal election campaign the Municipality of Colchester joined the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM)'s calling all federal parties to work with communities of all sizes to drive a stronger, more inclusive nationwide recovery—releasing a package of achievable frontline solutions to pressing challenges, from job creation to climate resilience to the housing crisis.

"All pandemic long, municipal leaders have supported Canadians through these times, and we're equally vital to Canada's recovery," said Geoff Stewart FCM Third Vice President. "We are the level of government closest to the people, we know the issues that are affecting everyday lives of our residents."

Frontline Solutions for Canada's Recovery consolidates proposals that leverage municipal and federal leadership to drive sustainable growth and build better lives for Canadians. They include:

Frontline community investment: including doubling the job-creating Canada Community-Building Fund (formerly Gas Tax Fund) that empowers communities of all sizes to renew core infrastructure—from safe roads that keep people moving to cultural/recreation facilities that

promote social inclusion. D

Digital inclusion for all Canadians: building on recent progress to ensure everyone can access a reliable, affordable, high-speed Internet connection—focussing on rural, remote, northern and Indigenous communities, where the digital divide has been so starkly exposed by the pandemic.

Frontline solutions to the housing crisis: from scaling up the proven Rapid Housing Initiative to end homelessness to expanding affordable rental options for Canadians facing inadequate, overcrowded housing—disproportionately among Indigenous, racialized and newcomer communities.

"What municipalities called for is important not only for the future of our country, but also here, in Colchester," said Geoff Stewart. Our housing, infrastructure and climate solutions generate good jobs. By empowering our community to renew infrastructure faster—from expanding and enhancing broadband and cell coverage to our residents, maintaining and upgrading water treatment facilities and road networks—we'll also be supporting the local economy and improving our quality of life."
