DRIVER CHARGED AFTER SERIOUS COLLISION

Colchester County District RCMP has charged a driver after a serious collision on Hwy. 2 in Shubenacadie on September 11th. At approximately 2:50 p.m., police responded to a motor vehicle collision on Hwy. 2 in Shubenacadie. Police learned a blue SUV had turned onto Hwy. 2 from a side road and was struck by a motorcycle that had been travelling north on Hwy. 2.

The motorcycle rider, a 38-year-old Colchester County man, suffered serious injuries and was transported to hospital by LifeFlight. The driver of the SUV, a 41-year-old Dartmouth man, and the passenger, an 8-year-old child, were not injured. The driver of the SUV was issued a Summary Offence Ticket at the scene for Failing to Yield under Section 122(2) of the Motor Vehicle Act. The ticket carries a fine of \$180.00.

NEW OFFICE SEES EARLY SUCCESS

The newly created Office of Health Care Professionals Recruitment is seeing some early successes and promising leads. Two anesthetists and a psychiatrist have signed job offers to practice in Cape Breton, and two family doctors practising in Halifax have worked with the office to address concerns and will now stay in Nova Scotia. Several other physicians are also consulting with the office to come to, or stay in, the province.

The new office is focused on attracting and keeping health-care professionals. It will also work to eliminate barriers to recruitment and retention. A planned pilot project aims to make the continuing care assistant profession more attractive by offering on-site child care at a nursing home in Sydney. Continuing care assistants report they have difficulty finding child care in keeping with their shifts. The stand-alone Office of Health Care Professionals Recruitment reports directly to the Minister of Health and Wellness.
