FRONT PAGE BRIEFS October 2023

A Bass River Community Meeting hosted by MLA Tom Taggart to discuss Option 4 for the new bridge to be built in 2024-2025. The meeting will be held at Victoria Hall, from 6:00-8:00 pm.

The first session of the 64th general assembly will resume Thursday, October 12, at 1 p.m.

The following organizations will receive a total of \$11,245 to upgrade and expand the accessibility of local trails. Mi'kmawey Debert Cultural Centre: \$7,861 towards replacing stairs, the boardwalk and signage. Tatamagouche Area Trails Association: \$3,384 towards the resurfacing of 3.7 kilometres of trail as well as general management along the provincial rail bed.

After a strong start to the year, visitation softened in June. According to statistics gathered by Tourism Nova Scotia, Nova Scotia welcomed 212,000 visitors in the month of June 2023, a 1% decline (1,000 fewer visitors) compared with June 2022, and a 7% decline (17,000 fewer visitors) compared with June 2019. Softer visitation in June is largely a result of fewer visitors from Atlantic Canada, the largest source of visitors to Nova Scotia. On the other hand, visitation from other parts of Canada and overseas continued to grow even beyond 2019 levels.

Collaborative Family Practice Clinic Opens

On September 8th Tom Taggart MLA said, "I'm pleased to be here today, on behalf of Michelle Thompson, Minister of Health and Wellness to announce the official opening of the Masstown Collaborative Family Practice Clinic".

Access to primary health-

care is a challenge we're faced with in our system today but I am pleased to report the clinic has been accepting patients since June and that is leading to better access to primary healthcare for people living in west Colchester County.

Taggart added, "The clinic

we are in today is a new clinic and the first turnkey clinic in the community. Turnkey clinics remove the administrative burden from healthcare professionals, which allow them to focus their time on patient care. That is also why ownership of the Bass River Collaborative Family Practice clinic

was transitioned to Nova Scotia Health earlier this year".

After consultation with the West Colchester Community Health Centre Society and local community engagement, it was decided that Nova Scotia Health taking on ownership of the clinic would create the most stability and sustainability for the service. Both clinics will benefit from a shared health team. This model creates opportunities for cross coverage. It also allows teams to build support networks by working in a team and sharing finite health human re-

TRUTH and RECONCILIATION Day

SEPTEMBER 30TH

This year, September 30th falls on a Saturday and therefore provincial government offices, public schools, and regulated childcare will be closed on Monday, October 2. Federal government offices and federally regulated workplaces will also be closed on October 2.

Currently, Truth and Reconciliation Day is not a paid general holiday under Nova Scotia's Labour Standards Code, nor a retail closing day under retail closing legislation.

Businesses are not required to close on September 30 or October 2, they can choose to remain open.

We encourage employers to find ways to acknowledge this day and the harms caused by residential schools as a vital part of the reconciliation process.
