Darcy Dobson, daughter of Heather O'Brien offered heartfelt words of appreciation to her father Teddy O'Brien and to Nick Beaton. She thanked the Colchester County Parks and Recreation Department for all they did for the last two years and all the work that had been put into the Park, including the number of extra hours that went into making it perfect for the opening. Darcy noted there is still more to come, it is a work in progress.

She wanted to send a special thank you to the community, noting there were too many to list right now, but recognizes so many who donated to make this park a reality. There will be a permanent way to recognize those people in the park eventually. "Without this community we wouldn't have this," says Darcy adding. "Today is about giving

back to a community that has given us something so beautiful after a tragedy."

A special presentation was made to Colchester Councillor Marie-Irving Benoit. "Marie Irving-Benoit is the reason we are standing here today. She listened to us a lot of late nights. She put everything she had into this place and I would like to thank her in front of you because she deserves that recognition," said Darcy before an emotional presentation of flowers to Marie.

Nick Beaton, husband of Kristen Beaton also added his appreciation to those "near, far and beyond, people not even from Canada who have reached out" and he thanked everyone who has made the park happen. He also thanked Marie Irving-Benoit who he says, "took their wants and wishes and wouldn't take no for an answer and made sure everything is what we wanted it to be." He was appreciative to Colchester County Parks and Recreation for their "labour of love" and the time they put into making sure everything was right. He added a special thank-you to his mother Bev for helping make Kristen's sight so special and to all those, including family

The officially opening of Heart's Haven Memorial Park took place on the bridge joining the two memorial spaces into one where a plaque reads "love is the bridge between

two hearts." The ribbon on Kristen's end was cut by her son Dax and on Heather's side her grandson Parker Devine cut the ribbon. Dax Beaton and other family members placed locks of love on the bridge.

The Park is located between Home Hardware and the former Military Base along Plains Road. It is open to the public during daylight hours, seven days a week.
