the permanent part-time pool. Recruiting into the permanent part-time pool is ongoing. Currently there are two open positions.

Production and Markets:

Markets for plastic materials has flattened out and we are currently holding inventory in anticipation of an up-trend in September. Fiber material has rebounded moderately but well off from the first half of 2022 pricing. Trends continue to show a lower but stabilizing market for the remainder of 2023. March through July production had 4440 commodity units produced and 3835 units shipped.

Completed a pilot project with Sustane Technologies in Chester NS using bales of MRF plastics residual and baled old broken green carts. Green carts proved to be successful but MRF residual material not

workable in their process at this time. Provided samples of MRF residual material and non-deposit glass to Lafarge Geocycle operations in Brookfield for laboratory testing for anticipated use as an alternative fuel in the kiln operations - planned viewing of their current construction operation scheduled for September 20th.

Projects/Operations:

Eastern side downspouts and parking area light pole replacement are two remaining items left from the hurricane damage from last fall - both should be completed in the next few weeks. Styrofoam densifier system has been vented to the roof and exhaust fan upsized and replaced. Reliability of the tele-boom loader continues to be a concern.
